Hello Ladies and Legionnaires;

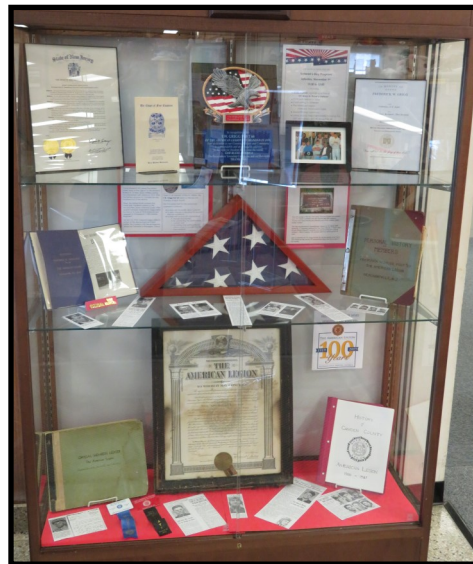
